NEBDN Fluoride Application for Dental Nurses

Course content

- Roles and responsibilities in the application of fluoride
- Guidelines on the practice of fluoride application
- Oral health promotion, including communication skills
- Caries including the presentation and aetiology along with prevalence
- Oral conditions and contraindications to fluoride application
- History of fluoride including theories and evidence
- Patient assessment, clinical methods of recording and equipment needed
- Patient management including fear, anxiety and non-clinical issues
- Health and safety
- Infection control
- Medical emergencies
- Legal and ethics
- Requirements of dental nurses applying fluoride varnish and providing oral health advice
- Scope of practice and CPD requirements including PDP and clinical governance
- Evidence based practice and the relevance of outside bodies
- Clinical records including the retrieval and utilisation of data recorded in clinical systems & confidentiality

The course also incorporates the Record of Competence (RoC), which is now a mandatory part of the syllabus and evidence of completion must be submitted to the NEBDN by the tutor before a place to sit the exam will be permitted.

The RoC consists of 3 parts

Part A: 12 PCAS - Fluoride Application

Range:

Child 3-10 years

Young person 11 - 15 years

Adult 16 years and over

Requirements:

3 patients from each range & a further 3 patients from any range

Part B: 3 PCAS - Delivering Oral Health Child 3 - 10 years Young person 11 - 15 years Adult 16 years and over

1 patient from each range

Part C: Supplementary Outcomes

Provide a copy of BLS certificate including choking and AED Completed - Management of Anaphylaxis

Complete - Delivering better oral health

Complete - Patient Information / Pre & Post Op Instructions Complete - Equipment required for fluoride application

Complete - Reflective practice

Complete - Log of CPD
